Self-defense program

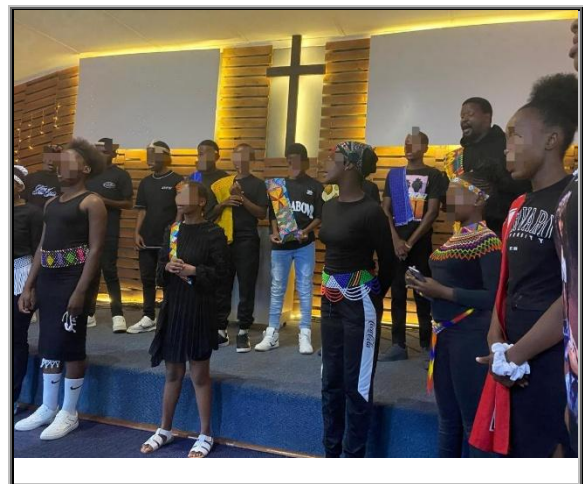


Learning self-defense is an important skill for children, giving them the tools to protect themselves when faced with a threatening situation. It's not just about physical techniques;
